Campus Debit Card

A Campus Debit Card is your new I.D. card that functions as a debit card for purchases made exclusively on your school's campus. The purchase amount will be debited from funds on deposit in a First Financial checking account.

You Should Know:

- Campus Debit Cards will be distributed in homeroom at the **START OF SCHOOL**
- The card can only be linked to a CHECKING ACCOUNT
- The card will work on **CAMPUS ONLY**. A Visa® Debit Card can be added to the account for use in the bookstore and off campus
- Sign up for **eALERTS** through Online Banking for cell phone or email account notification

- **MOBILE DEPOSIT**
- ONLINE BANKING TRANSFERS from an existing First Financial FCU account
- ONLINE PAYMENT with a checking or savings account at another institution or with a non-First Financial debit or credit card.

- Security is Important! Do not tell anyone your PIN or let anyone use your card.
